

# The Study of Participatory Research in India

## Experience

### New Delhi, Haryana, McLeod Ganj, Agra and Jaipur!

This is an academic experience where participants are immersed in the work of PRIA ([www.pria.org](http://www.pria.org)). You will have the opportunity to meet, listen, learn from and interact with experts in the fields of Participatory Research, Environmental Governance, Gender Mainstreaming, and Civil Society Building. Infused into the experience are visits to significant cultural, historical, and geographical spaces.

Participants will spend a week in New Delhi studying Participatory Research Methodology, conversing with experts and looking at Case Studies. They will then travel North to Haryana and then McLeod Ganj looking at Participatory Research projects in the rural landscape. Finally, participants will travel South for a week to Jaipur, Rajasthan to see Participatory Research Practices and Community-based action in practice. One weekend will also be spent in Agra in order to take in the sights and sounds of the Taj Mahal.

Dates: July 4th – July 22nd, 2011

Maximum Participants: 18

Cost: \$2000.00 (includes all ground transportation, accommodation, most meals, and program fees) plus airfare (Last year's airfare was between \$1200.00 and \$1600.00).
