Canadian International School of Egypt (CISE)

The Canadian International School of Egypt (CISE) opened its doors on September 15, 2002. It is the first Canadian school certified by the Ministry of Education of Ontario in Egypt and the Middle East. The Egyptian initiators of this project chose the Province of Ontario, Canada's most populated province, to provide the curriculum and most of the teaching staff for the school.



The focus of the instructional programme includes literacy, numeracy, science and technology. The physical, emotional, social and meta-cognitive development of students is a key aspect of our balanced program. CISE is designed to support students who wish to pursue an academic program. It does not have the resources to provide substantial support for exceptional learners. Within this context however, accommodations are made for English as a Second Language needs.

The CISE teaching staff is comprised of Canadian teachers, trained and experienced in delivering the education program of the Province of Ontario and utilizing the best proven Canadian and International pedagogy. The Arabic and Religion programs are taught by highly qualified and experienced Egyptian teachers.

The school is entering its ninth year of operation as a Pre-Kindergarten to Grade Twelve school. Our fifth secondary school graduation took place at the end of last June. All of our graduates have gone on to study in tier one universities in Egypt, Canada and Europe.

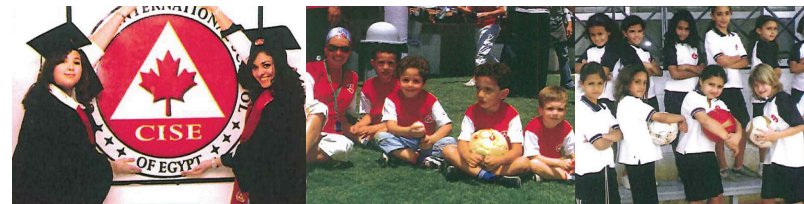
The academic program meets the requirements of the Ontario Ministry of Education and is delivered in keeping with Ontario Ministry of Education guidelines. Its approved

status can be viewed at www.edu.gov.on.ca/eng/general/list/oversea.html. Support materials are purchased through the Canadian Bureau for International Education from sources in Canada or by the school from sources in Egypt.

English is the language of instruction. Arabic, Religion and Social Studies are taught as requirements, from Junior Kindergarten to the end of Grade Twelve. French is taught as a second language from Junior Kindergarten to the end of Grade Nine as well. It becomes an option for the rest of the student's high school years.

CISE is a fully integrated, multicultural school open to any student who meets the entrance requirements. Our student population is approximately 85% Egyptian with students from several other countries including Zambia, Finland, Canada, U.S., Mozambique, Zimbabwe, China and Korea as a partial list.

Egypt, Africa's most populous country (almost 80 million people in a most recent census), is located in the northeastern corner of the continent bordered by the Mediterranean Sea in the North, Libya in the West, Sudan in the South and the Red Sea, and the Suez Canal in the East. While geographically part of the Africa continent, Egyptians generally see themselves culturally and politically as citizens of the Middle East.

Cairo, Egypt's capital is a city of 18 million people. It is home to a number of Egypt's most famous sites which include the Sphinx and Great Pyramids of Giza. Coptic (Christian) and Islamic Cairo are sites where history lives today. Mosques and churches are everywhere attesting, to the essential character of Egypt as a nation of believers.
